In appreciation of the quality education provided by Tunghai, 44 alumni from the 20th class of the Department of Economics (DoE), who now have established well-off careers, donated one million NT dollars to the Department. The donation was for the DoE to provide more resources to its current students. The donation ceremony was held on April 21st, 2016.

Tunghai president Dr. Mao-Jiun Wang and the Dean of the College of Social Sciences Prof. Jeng Liu represented the school to receive the donation. Twelve representative alumni as well as DoE Chairperson Prof. Huei-Ling Hou and many professors attended. Besides appreciating the contribution of the alumni, the DoE established the Tunghai Economics Outstanding Program with the donation. The purpose is to re-build the special relationships among peer students as well as between teachers and students. On one hand, it aims to aspire and engage students into their studies; on the other hand, it gives positive feedback to teachers' teaching. It is to advance Tunghai Economics to become one of the best departments nationally.

The alumni also shared their personal experiences and insights regarding future career paths for current students. The youngsters learned new insights and gained advices from the precedents who have seen much more of the career markets and become better prepared for their future.

THU Chinese Language Center Granted Funding by the Ministry of Education

Due to the growing economic market in China, the global need of Chinese language teaching had dramatically increased. The Ministry of Education has established a project named "Exporting Chinese Language Education" to promote overseas Chinese language education by combining the power of industry, government and universities. The THU Chinese Language Center (CLC) was granted funding to conduct part of the project to send professional Chinese language teachers to the United States and Japan.

THU has established a solid partnership with education industries in Japan. Through this collaboration, Chinese language training centers in Sapporo, Sendai, Ibaraki, Tokyo, Yokohama, Nagoya, Osaka, Hiroshima, Hakata and Okinawa have been set up. Starting 2016, the collaborations will be extended to Japanese high schools to establish second language courses in Chinese. Through the supports of the government, partner institutions and industries, the CLC anticipates an active promotion of the Mandarin Chinese teaching endeavor in target overseas markets effectively.

2016 International Conference on Cross-Strait Sustainability Management

On April 30th, the College of Management hosted “2016 International Conference on Cross-Strait Sustainability Management”. Scholars and professionals from China, Taiwan and worldwide were invited to share their observations, opinions and research results. The topics included innovations, changes and challenges faced by global economy and business development.

The keynote speakers were Dr. Chuah Hean Teik, President of Universiti Tunku Abdul Rahman, Malaysia; Dr. Tsong-Ming Lu, Dean of Faculty of Business Administration of Seijoh University, Japan; Dr. Kuo-Ming Wang, Honorary Professor of Yuan Ze University; and Dr. Ho-Min Chen, Professor of College of Management, National Taiwan University. The topics of internationalization of a university, corporate innovation and venture business, business application models, business optimization, and industry 4.0 were presented and shared.

This conference created a platform for opinion exchanges between the academia and the industry. By sharing different viewpoints, new perspectives in academic-industrial collaborations could be generated.

On April 22 and 23, Department of Philosophy hosted an international academic seminar. Around 50 scholars from all over the world attended this seminar and announced about 39 papers. THU President Dr. Mao-Jiun Wang and Dean of the College of Arts Dr. Yuan Fang Tung welcomed the participants.

It is a tradition for the THU Department of Philosophy to host large scale seminars every two years, inviting scholars to exchange ideas from their research.
